Worship

ACOLYTES AND VERGERS:

7th through 12th grade youth serve as Acolytes in the Eucharistic service by assisting the priest, carrying processional candles and crosses, and other duties. School service hours may be met by this ministry. Vergers oversee the lay ministers at Sunday services and attend to other liturgical details for the smooth running of the service.

DIGITAL MINISTRY:

Run the audio and video for services in the Sanctuary—which involves monitoring the sound and video systems to ensure proper volumes, camera coverage, recording and troubleshooting. An important part of the ministry is facilitating holiday services which expand the audio and video capabilities throughout the church building to accommodate the increased number of parishioners attending those services. The Tape Ministry records the sermons on Sunday mornings, makes copies and takes orders as required, especially for the homebound.

Children & Youth

CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES:

Children's Ministries includes programs for 3 year olds through 6th graders and is designed to provide basic Christian education and fellowship opportunities through a weekly Sunday School program and special enrichment activities. We are currently utilizing the Episcopal Children's Curriculum developed by the Virginia Theological Seminary. This three-year curriculum offers a sequence of topics that include the Bible, sacraments, and historical events in the Church. For the 2016–2017 program year we will explore the *Shell* curriculum which focuses on Baptism.

In addition to the formation offerings, several special enrichment events occur throughout the year including: All Saints Day Celebration, Epiphany Pageant - Festival of Lights, 8-week Study of the Holy Eucharist, Christian Seder Meal, and a Walk Through Holy Week.

CONFIRM NOT CONFORM (CNC):

Confirm not Conform is offered on Monday nights at the Rodman House. It is a one-year program open to all 10th through 12th graders considering confirmation in the Episcopal Church and it is designed to help participants to take real responsibility for understanding their faith and its power and possibilities. Candidates can make the choice to participate in this program, and upon completion, can then make the choice to be confirmed. Goals of the Confirm not Conform program are: (1) to encourage program participants to open their hearts and minds in ways that will help them question and explore what they really believe about the Christian faith and the Church, and why they believe what they do; (2) to help them ask the tough questions and to engage the issues of their time in real and honest ways, and to then seek out answers to their questions through prayer, conversation, action, and reflection with each other and with adult mentors; (3) and to help them to see, understand, and believe that they can take ownership of and responsibility for their faith and for their roles in the church.
